To whom it may concern,

The purpose of this letter is to reiterate the vaccine laws in Oklahoma, specifically the exemption provisions relating to public schools and DHS licensed daycare facilities.

In the state of Oklahoma, there are currently three different forms of exemption: medical, religious, and philosophical.

Any minor child, through his/her parent, guardian, or legal custodian, may submit to the health authority charged with the enforcement of the immunization laws of this state:

- 1. A certificate of a licensed physician, as defined in Section 725.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, stating that the physical condition of the child is such that immunization would endanger the life or health of the child; or*
- 2. A written statement by the parent, guardian or legal custodian of the child objecting to immunization of the child;*

Whereupon the child shall be exempt from the immunization laws of this state, pursuant to Section 1210.192 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes (Added by Laws 1970, c. 225, § 2, emerg. eff. April 15, 1970. Amended by Laws 1998, c. 181, § 4, eff. Nov. 1, 1998. See also Section 7(d) of Oklahoma's Parents Bill of Rights (HB1384).

Please provide form OHD 216-A Certificate of Exemption, issued by the Oklahoma State Department of Health (ODH). To obtain copies of ODH Form 216-A, see your local Health Department or Board of Education.

If your school district or daycare is unable to provide a form, a completed copy of this form filled out by the legal guardian of the student is acceptable until forms are made available by your school district.
